

Meet The Sunshine Group

GOOD TIMES, GREAT COMPANY & A BUS FULL OF LAUGHS





Every third Thursday of the month, a group of twelve adventurers sets out for a day of good food, great company, and a whole lot of laughs. This is the Sunshine Group – a social group for individuals with disability who've been coming together for years, and who always have room for new friends.

Whether it's lunch at a cosy restaurant, a ferry ride on the harbour, a visit to a wildlife park, or a day out at a local club, each month brings a new destination, and a fresh opportunity to connect. Sunshine Group outings are all about getting out in the community and having a great time while you're at it.

And while the venues may change, one thing stays the same: the laughter on the bus, the comfort of old friends, and the warmth of being part of something special.

Darren & Julie - "It's Like a Family on the Bus!"

Hurstville couple Darren and Julie have been coming along to Sunshine outings for more than two years. Julie first heard about the group through a friend at her supported employment service, and the rest is history.

They've been together since 1993 and say going on the outings as a couple is one of the highlights of their month. "When Julie gets the newsletter and sees where we're going, it's something to get excited about," Darren said.




Darren & Julie: "It doesn't really matter where we go. It's about who we're with."

Pam & Chris: Along for the Ride Since the Very Beginning

Pam and her husband Chris have been with the Sunshine Group since the very first St George Community-led outing in 2021 – a day trip to Symbio Wildlife Park.

Originally introduced to the group through 3Bridges, Pam says she and Chris haven't missed many since. "I love all the outings," she said. "I look forward to them every month."

The couple lives in Rockdale and say the bus ride is one of their favourite parts of the day. They've made friends like Darren, Julie, and Cameron through the group, and are always happy to go wherever the next outing takes them. "We just go with the flow," Pam said.



Cameron: A Hat, A Laugh and a Whole Lot of Heart

You'll usually spot Cameron by his signature Crocodile Dundee-style hat – he's on his third one, and he only replaces it when the top wears through. He's got a sharp sense of humour and has been part of the Sunshine Group longer than he can remember. "It must be more than ten years," he said. "I've probably been on over 100 outings!"

Now 58 and living in Peakhurst, Cameron said the group is less about the destination and more about the people.

Still, he has his favourites. "That Bundeena trip

 the ferry, the drive through the park, a lunch and a schooner in the RSL – that was a good day," he grinned.

Cameron also receives weekly 1:1 support from St George Community Support Worker, Vera, which gives him another chance to get out to appointments, parks and cafés. But it's the Sunshine Group where he really lights up – especially with his good mate Sam.

"We are always stirring each other up," said Cameron.

Both Sam and Cameron really love support worker Bronwyn, who is a constant on the Sunshine Group outings. Cameron said that she is kind, and makes everyone laugh on the bus, and she is also fierce and works hard to keep everyone safe. "We all just love her," said Cameron, "but don't tell her I said so or she'll get a big head!"

Bronwyn, The Heart Behind the Outings

Support worker Bronwyn Fallon has been a constant presence on Sunshine Group outings since St George Community took the reins in 2021. But the program itself goes back more than 25 years.

Originally run by another community organisation, the outings were at risk of ending due to funding challenges. St George Community stepped in to keep them going and Bronwyn helped ensure the transition was seamless.



Bronwyn: "What's my favourite part? The people. They turn up every month, rain or shine, excited to see each other again. That's what it's all about." Since then, she's made it her mission to keep the outings fresh, inclusive and far from predictable.

"We always try to avoid the usual clichés," she said. "There's only so much ten pin bowling people can take."

Instead, she works with participants to choose outings that are scenic, social and a little bit different. "It's a group effort. Everyone has a say in where we go, and we mix it up to suit different interests and abilities."






