#### **Farewell to Mark Scheuer**

Our Santa, Our Fleet Manager, Our Friend

When it comes to community, few people have given more than Mark Scheuer. After 12 years with St George Community - and many more volunteering with the SES - Mark is hanging up his fleet keys and heading down the coast to enjoy a well-earned retirement.

Mark would be the first to stop us right here and say: "Don't call it retirement." He's not a fan of the word. So instead, we've floated some alternatives - bon vivant, man of leisure, gentleman of the coast... take your pick. Whatever the label, we know he'll embrace this next stage with the same energy, wit, and generosity he brought to St George Community.



Mark joined us in 2012 as a driver, bringing with him a calmness and sense of responsibility that soon saw him step into leadership roles. By the time he became Fleet Manager, he was overseeing the safety and logistics of more than 27 vehicles and thousands of trips each year. Safety wasn't just his job description, as one colleague put it, "it's something he lives by."



But ask around the office, and it's not just Mark's diligence people remember. It's his humour, generosity, and the small gestures that made everyone feel part of the team. ### A New Aged Care Act – Starting 1 November 2025

The new **Australian Aged Care Act** (the Aged Care Act 2024) will start on **1 November 2025**, replacing existing legislation to create a stronger, rights-based system that prioritises older Australians.



#### What's Changing?

- Your Rights Come First Older Australians are placed at the centre of care.
- **Statement of Rights** A clear, legally binding list of your rights, including independence, privacy, and access to safe, high-quality care.
- Better Care Standards Stronger rules to ensure care meets your individual needs.
- More Oversight Providers will be monitored more closely to make sure they meet their responsibilities.
- **Help with Decisions** You can choose someone you trust to support you in making care decisions.

#### What This Means for You

- For Older People: More dignity, respect, privacy, and choice in your care.
- For Families & Carers: Peace of mind knowing your loved one's rights are protected.
- For the Community: A clearer and fairer aged care system that works for everyone.



#### What St George Community Is Doing

At St George Community, we have been working hard to ensure we are ready for the new Act. This includes:

- Updating our policies and procedures to reflect the new requirements.
- Staff training and briefings so our team understands your rights and the new care standards.
- Strengthening safety and privacy protocols to protect both your wellbeing and your personal information.
- Stress-testing our systems so everything is checked and ready before the new rules begin.



We are committed to providing safe, respectful, and high-quality services under the new Aged Care Act.

#### THE STATEMENT OF RIGHTS

The Statement of Rights clearly identifies your rights when seeking or receiving aged care services. Under the Aged Care Act 2024, your provider and aged care workers are legally obliged to deliver services in line with these rights.

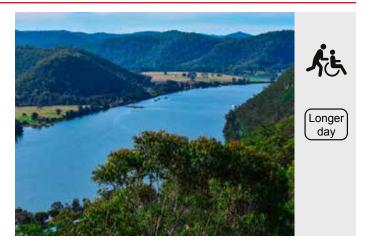

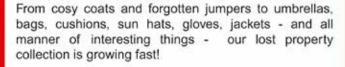
